

Mark Lieberman Wins 1973

Blair Leads Prep Mat Tourney

Blair Academy, led by a defending champion from Allentown and coached by a former Lehigh eastern title holder, led the way yesterday during the preliminary and quarter-final rounds of the 38th annual National Prep School Wrestling Tournament at Lehigh University.

Mark Lieberman, a winner at 158 in 1972 and now competing in the 188-pound division, was one of four Blair grapplers advancing to today's semi-final round.

The others were Geoff

VanSickle at 115, Tim Burns at 148 and Pete Englehardt at 158.

Mark Lieberman's older brother, Mike, is a regular on the Lehigh varsity and Tom Hutchinson, a two-time eastern titlist for the Engineers, coaches the Blairstown, N.J., team.

Last weekend Blair captured the New Jersey Prep School state championship.

With defending team champion Milton Hershey ineligible this year because of a change in the school's wrestling affiliation, the title is up for grabs and a wide-open

scramble began yesterday.

Blair led after the first day with its four survivors and 18 points. Lawrenceville had 15½ and three survivors. University School of Shaker Heights, O., had 15 points and three men left. Western Reserve of Hudson, O., had 14½ points, Germantown Academy 13½, Academy of the New Church 13 and Haverford School 12.

Haverford and St. Christopher's of Richmond, Va., were the only others to have three title contenders remaining. Lieberman, after a 7-1 opening

round triumph, pinned Pat Hart of Archmere Academy, Claymont, Del., in 4:09 during the quarter-finals.

Only one other defending champion was entered. Doug Weiss of the University School, a winner at 122 last season, is battling at 129 and he had falls in 2:46, 3:19 and 3:57 during three appearances yesterday.

Championship bouts start tonight at 7 o'clock in Grace Hall on the Lehigh campus. Semi-finals were slated for noon today followed immediately by consolation rounds.

Haverford Matmen Take Prep Crown

1973

Haverford School couldn't place an individual winner in the weekend prep school national wrestling championships at Lehigh University but still managed to walk off with team honors.

Coach Neil Buckley's squad totaled 51 points against 50½ for Blair and 46½ for Lawrenceville to round out the Top Three.

Blair left Grace Hall with two titlists, one of them Mark Lieberman of Allentown who gained honors at 188 pounds and was named Most Outstanding Wrestler in the tournament.

The New Jerseyans, coached by ex-Lehigh eastern champion Tom Hutchinson, went into the finals with a chance to overtake Haverford if they registered a pair of falls and both of Haver-

ford's finalists lost.

This unlikely combination would've given Blair the championship, 51½ to 51. Both Haverford finalists bowed but Blair could get only one of the two pins it needed to squeeze through.

The other Blair winner, besides Lieberman who finished off his man in 3:01, was Geoff VanSickle at 115 and he had to be content with a 5-2 margin.

Lieberman, and Doug Weiss of the University School at Shaker Heights, O., successfully defended titles won in 1972. Weiss breezed through in the 129-pound weight class with a 19-6 triumph in the title round.

3 Blair Wrestlers Win Titles

Randy Miller, Bob Kehler and Mark Lieberman marched to the winners' circle in that order Saturday, helping Blair Academy nail down first place in the 39th annual Prep School national championship wrestling tournament at Lehigh University.

The Blairstown, N. J., grapplers — coached by former Lehigh star Tom Hutchinson — accumulated 65 points to gain a title which barely eluded them last season when they scored 50½ against 51 for winning Haverford School.

Blue Ridge School, of Dyke, Va., placed second with 48½ and Hill School, of Pottstown, was third with 33½. Rounding out the top five, in a field of 62 prep schools and academies, were Germantown Academy of Philadelphia 28 and Shady Side Academy of Pittsburgh 27½.

Lieberman, voted Most Outstanding Wrestler honors

in this tourney for the second straight season, racked up three falls getting to the finals at 188 pounds and then manhandled Tony Couto of Wyoming Seminary of Kingston 23-0.

Both are Allentownians although Lieberman enrolled at Blair four years ago while Couto went to Central Catholic H.S.

Mike Lieberman, Mark's older brother, is expected to rejoin the varsity mat squad at Lehigh next season after sitting out 1973-74 action. Mark, according to persistent reports on the Engineer campus, and his brother will be teammates in 1974-75 competition.

Blair advanced four men to the tournament finals and only one bad move, by 148-pounder Mike Sickles, prevented the New Jerseyans from getting four titles.

Sickles, leading Dave Martin of Shady Side 1-0, shot in for a takedown only to have Martin instantaneously reverse him into a three-point near fall. It was a five-point maneuver, enough to turn the bout in Martin's favor.

Miller, of Nazareth, downed Seth Greenky of Nichols School, Buffalo, N.J., in the 122-pound finals. Kehler followed at 141 with a 4:29 pin over Bob Bishop of Westtown School, Westtown, Pa., and Lieberman finished off the powerful display with his one-sided rout at 188.

Lieberman was awarded a penalty point at the start of the bout when Couto was charged with butting. He then registered a takedown, six near-falls and a reversal.

The Allentown youngster

was the second defending champion to retain his crown in the 1974 tournament. Joe Valente of Blue Ridge matched him in falls with three while going all the way at 115.

This was the first team title in this tournament, which began in 1935, for Blair.

Hutchinson, the winners'

coach, came out of the Lehigh intramural program during his undergraduate days to take EIWA titles at 190 and 177 ponds and captain the Engineers.

Lieberman's Most Outstanding Wrestler trophy was presented by Mike Frick of Lehigh, only freshman ever voted that honor in an EIWA tournament.

Hutchinson accepted the Jimmy Detrixhe Memorial Trophy, which goes to the winning school, from Bill Leckonby, Lehigh's director of athletics. Detrixhe, a champion at Hill School and Lehigh, was Bethlehem star who gave his life in the Vietnam War. Like Hutchinson he was a two-time eastern title-holder and a Lehigh team captain.

Mrs. Billy Sheridan, widow of the great coach who directed Lehigh teams for 41 years, presented individual awards to the champion and runnerup in each of the 12 weight classes.

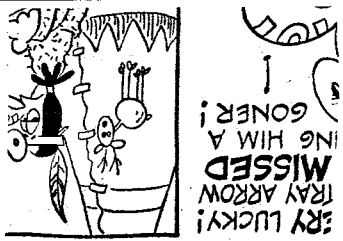

Blair Holds Slim Margin In Prep School Tourney

1974

Finals in the 39th annual Prep School Wrestling Tournament are scheduled for 7 o'clock tonight in Grace Hall, on the Lehigh University campus, with the survivors of a 300-man field shooting for individual and team honors.

Semifinals were this afternoon and they found Blair Academy of Blairstown, N. J. and Blue Ridge School, of Dyke, Va., battling for top spot.

Blair, coached by former Lehigh eastern intercollegiate champion Tom Hutchinson was seeking a crown it failed to gain in 1973 by the narrowest of margins, 50½ points against 51 for title-winning Haverford School.

Following the competition of last night's quarterfinals, Blair had 21½ points and Blue Ridge was challenging with 21. Each had four survivors. Haverford trailed with 11½ points and only one man remaining in the title field. Hill School had 10½ with three survivors and Nichols School of Buffalo, N. Y., boasted 9½ points and two grapplers still in contention.

Wyoming Seminary still had three men left but only six points after the first day's action. Thirty-three, of the 62-

school field, were represented in the semis.

Blair's survivors were defending 138-pound champion Mark Lieberman of Allentown, 122-pounder Randy Miller of Nazareth, 141-pounder Bob Kehler and 148-pounder Mike Sickles. Highly-rated Joe Skutches, also of Nazareth, was lost to the Blair cause when he suffered a broken collar bone and had to default in the quarterfinals.

Lieberman, voted Most Outstanding in last year's tourney, began his bid for retaining that honor with falls over Don Yeatman of Wroxeter in 5:52 and Tom Edson of Shady Side in 1:45.

Miller won 8-0, 13-0 and 2-0 decisions, the latter in overtime after a 2-2 draw against Jeff Shaw of Haverford.

Blue Ridge School of Dyke, for Lehigh, presented the award Va., and McDonogh School of to Hauserman. McDonogh, Md., shared honors Saturday in the final rounds of the 40th annual Prep School national wrestling championships in Grace Hall on the Lehigh University campus.

In one of the biggest prep tournaments during recent years — 65 schools and 350 matmen — Blue Ridge captured the team title without an individual winner.

McDonogh, which had only four entries, placed three individual champions and one third for 7 1/2 points. Blue Ridge totaled 9 1/2. St. Andrew's Prep, of Middletown, Del., was third with 46 and Mt. St. Joseph's, of Baltimore, Md., totaled 44.

Two of the more-familiar names to followers of this tourney, The Hill School of Pottstown, Pa., and Blair Academy of Blairtown, N. J., finished well behind the leaders. Blair, the 1974 winner, placed ninth with 23 1/2 and Hill tied for 12th with 21 1/2.

Blair had three individual champions but only one of them, 101-pounder Bruce Davidson, counted in the scoring. Kelly Ward (148) and Mike Newbern (158) are five-year students who participated unattached and

Bill Leckonby, director of athletics at Lehigh, presented the James B. Detrixhe Memorial Trophy to Blue Ridge. This award honors the name of a former Lehigh eastern champion, from Bethlehem, who gave his life in the Vietnam war.

Mrs. Billy Sheridan, widow of the former Lehigh coaching great, presented individual trophies to winners and runners-up in the weight classes.

Blue Ridge, second in the 1974 tourney, advanced five men to the semi-finals where three of them were beaten. The two survivors in the finals also lost but McDonogh, the closest challenger, simply didn't have enough entries to close the gap.

Six defending champions participated and only one of them, 141-pounder Brian Boyle of St. Andrews, repeated. A seventh 1974 winner, Randy Miller of Blair Academy, and Hecklow, was unable to participate because of an injury.
